The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

The notation '[DP]' in a rule means that the penalty for a breach of the rule may, at the discretion of the jury be less than disqualification. This changes RRS 64.2.

The notation [SP] in a rule of the SIs means that a standard penalty may be applied by the race committee without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1 and A5.

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing. Other documents under RRS Definition Rule (g) include:
- (a) [SP] The OKDIA Major Championship Event Manual
- (b) [DP] [SP] Equipment Regulations (ER)
- 1.2 The OKDIA Major Championship Event Manual may be changed by this Notice of Race or by the Sailing Instructions, with the approval of OKDIA.
- 1.3 RRS Appendix P will apply.
- 1.4 RRS 40.1 shall apply at all times while afloat.
- 1.5 [NP] [DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with any reasonable request from an event official.
- 1.6 If there is a conflict between languages the English text takes precedence.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 The Sailing Instructions (SI) will be available on the event website at the time of registration. A hard copy will be available on request. A preliminary version may be posted on the event website prior to this date.
- 2.2 OKDIA would appreciate if the documents, including the Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions, could be read from electronic devices.

3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at https://www.rgys.com.au/sailingnoticeboard/ .
- 3.2 [DP] A boat's crew may place electronics on board, such as a phone or other devices, which must be sealed inside a buoyancy tank, but the crew shall neither make nor receive voice transmissions, radio or data communications from the time they leave the harbour until returning to the harbour, except in an emergency or when instructed by or using equipment provided by the race committee.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The event is open to all boats of the International OK Dinghy Class that comply with the Rules of the International OK Dinghy Association.
- 4.2 Eligible competitors shall be current members of an OKDIA recognised National OK Dinghy Association. They shall complete on-site registration at the venue prior to 26 February 2024, unless the Organizing Authority extends this date.
- 4.3 Entries shall be submitted online prior to 15th November 2023 unless extended by the Organising Authority.
- 4.4 Late entries may be accepted up to the 15th January 2024 unless extended by the Organising Authority.
- 4.5 The online entry form is available at https://www.rqys.com.au/OK-Dinghy-Worlds-2024-Entry, and completing this form indicates intention to participate and implies acceptance of the rules under RRS 4.1(a).
- 4.6 An entry is not complete until all entry fees have been paid, the entry accepted by the Organising Authority and OKDIA, and registration has been completed before the first race.





5. FEES

5.1 The Entry Fee is AUD \$600 and AUD \$300 for juniors (competitors under the age of 23 on the date of the first race of the Championship) and shall be paid in full by 15th November 2023 as detailed on the online entry form. For entries made after 15th November, a Late Entry Fee of an additional AUD 150 and AUD 75 for juniors will be applied.

6. [NP] [DP] ADVERTISING

6.1 Boats shall display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

7. COMPETITION FORMAT

- 7.1 Ten races are scheduled.
- 7.2 This format may be changed with the approval of OKDIA and will be specified in the Sailing Instructions.
- 7.3 The Race Committee in conjunction with OKDIA may decide to divide the fleet series into groups. The method of division will ensure groups of approximately equal size and ability and will be detailed in the Sailing Instructions.

- 8.2 Two races are scheduled for each day of racing.
- 8.3 An additional race may be scheduled on any day if there is a danger that a series (four races) may not be completed. A maximum of three races per day will be sailed.
- 8.4 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 15:00 hours.
- 8.5 The Reserve Day will only be used if less than four races have been completed.

9. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 9.1 This regatta is an international event for the purpose of RRS G1.1
- 9.2 A Technical Committee shall be appointed in accordance with RRS 92.

- 9.3 Boats shall be available for inspection in accordance with Notice of Race schedule.
- 9.4 A maximum of 1 hull, 1 mast, 1 boom, 2 sails, 1 centreboard and 1 rudder may be presented for equipment inspection.
- 9.5 The procedures for inspections will be specified in the ER.

10. VENUE

- 10.1 NoR Attachment A shows the plan of the event venue.
- 10.2 NoR Attachment B shows the approximate location of the racing area.

11. COURSES

11.1 The courses to be sailed will be as per the OKDIA Major Championship Event Manual, unless varied by the Sailing Instructions.

12. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 12.1 An international jury will be appointed as provided in RRS 70.5.
- 12.2 Decisions of the Jury will be final as provided in RRS 70.5.

13. SCORING

13.1 Four races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

14. [NP] [DP] SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS

- 14.1 Support vessels will be required to register and be insured as per NoR 18 to be permitted to use launching and berthing facilities at the venue. Registration may be completed online through the event website.
- 14.2 Support boats must comply with local regulations and event support boat regulations or sailing instructions.
- 14.3 Support boats must have a VHF radio capable of communicating on Chanel 16, 72 & 77.
- 14.4 All support boats shall clearly display the 3 letter national code of their World Sailing Member National Authority in contrasting colour to the background at all times while afloat. The minimum height for the letters shall be 200 mm and visible from both sides of the boat.
- 14.5 Registered support boats shall act as rescue boats in case of need. If the Race Committee displays flag V (see RRS 37) all support boats shall monitor VHF channel TBC at briefing and comply with requests from the Race Committee and any published Safety Procedures.
- 14.6 Support boats may be required to clearly display a flag or stickers provided by the OA with unique identification for that boat.
- 14.7 The Organising Authority may refuse registrations and accept later registrations at their sole discretion.

15. CHARTERED OR LOANED BOATS

15.1 A chartered or loaned boat may carry national letters or a sail number in contravention of her class rules, provided that the race committee is notified of her sail identification before the first race.

16. [NP][DP]BERTHING

- 16.1 Boats shall be kept within the Royal Queensland Yacht Squadron compound in their allocated places as described in the Sailing Instructions
- 16.2 Restrictions may be placed on where vessels may be stored or rigged by the RQYS Sailing or Marina office.
- 16.3 Boats may only be stored on the RQYS rigging lawn for the duration of the regatta and 24 hours before/after the regatta, unless otherwise approved by the OA.
- 16.4 No tie down restraints may penetrate the ground deeper than 300mm due to lawn irrigation systems.





17. MEDIA CONSENT

- 17.1 Competitors and/or their parents or guardians automatically grant the Organising Authority, OKDIA and any party to which they may delegate this right, without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show (including via the internet,) any motion pictures, still pictures, live, taped or filmed television, or any other form of media, of or relating to the event.
- 17.2 The top three competitors as well as the individual race winners may be required to attend a media press conference each day.
- 17.3 Competitors may be required for interviews at the regattas.

18. INSURANCE

18.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$5,000,000 AUD per incident or the equivalent.

19. PRIZES

19.1 Prizes will be awarded as follows:

Winner Race 3 – Mark & Jenny Fisher Cup

Winner Race 5 - Sønderborg Cup

Winner Race 6 - Kiel Yacht Club Clock

Winner Race 7 - New Zealand OK Class Clock

Winner Race 8 – Don & Brenda Andrews Trophy

Winner Race 9 – Heinrich Liedtke Memorial Trophy

Winner Race 10 - Kjell Nystrom Memorial Cup

Practice Race - Sven Lehn Memorial Salver

Best helmsman from host country - Clive Roberts Memorial Salver

1st Junior - Raymond Dodard Trophy

1st Veteran – Knud Olsen Trophy (over 40)

1st Master - The Blasse Trophy (over 55)

1st Grand Master – Jørgen Lindhardtsen Trophy (Over 70)

1st Female - The Woman's Trophy

Paul Elvstrøm Trophy – lowest score when all race scores are counted.

Endurance Award – Geest Trophy

- 19.2 The Organizing Authority shall present prizes to at least the top 10 overall, the winner of each race, and the winner of each category.
- 19.3 OKDIA will provide OKDIA ties for the top 10 overall and medals for the top three overall and the top three juniors.
- 19.4 If there are split fleets, as described 7.3, the method of allocation of race trophies in 19.1 may be modified. This will be detailed in the Sailing Instructions.
- 19.5 The Junior Prize is open to any competitor aged 23 or under on the date of the first race of the Championship.
- 19.6 The Veteran's Prize is open to any competitor aged 40 or over, and 54 and under, on the date of the first race of the Championship.
- 19.7 The Master's Prize is open to any competitor aged 55 or over, and 69 and under, on the date of the first race of the Championship.
- 19.8 The Grand Master's Prize is open to any competitor aged 70 or over, on the date of the first race of the Championship.





21. RISK STATEMENT

- 21.1 Rule 3 of the RRS states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone." Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor and support person agrees and acknowledges that:
- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the race organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- (g) The fact that the Race Committee conducts inspections, or not, of a boat does not reduce the responsibilities of each competitor set out in this Notice of Race.
