NOTICE OF RACE (NoR)

ORGANISING AUTHORITY

ROYAL QUEENSLAND YACHT SQUADRON LTD 578 Royal Esplanade, Manly, QLD 4179



The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

Notation '[DP]' in a rule means a penalty for a breach of the rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

Separate Notice of Race & Sailing Instructions will be posted for Incorporated events.

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 The prescriptions and special regulations of Australian Sailing Part 2 will apply.
- 1.3 The applicable class rules will apply.
- 1.4 Introductory Rules of Racing apply to Green Fleet sailors (See NoR Attachment C)
- 1.5 Appendix T Arbitration will apply.
- 1.6 RRS Abbreviated Appendix P will apply.
- 1.7 Competitors must follow all Club Policies (https://www.rqys.com.au/policiesanddocuments/)

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 The sailing instructions will be available after 1200 on 07/12/2023 at https://www.rqys.com.au/sailingnoticeboard/ .

3. COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 The online official notice board is located at https://www.rqys.com.au/sailingnoticeboard/ .
- 3.2 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The regatta is open to all World Sailing recognized senior and youth classes as well as nationally recognized classes approved by the Organising Authority.
- 4.2 All Australian competitors shall have a valid Australian Sailing Sailor Identification Number. Proof of this must be submitted with entry.
- 4.3 There are no age restrictions for this regatta.
- 4.4 A division shall be constituted once five (5) entries are received. The Organising Authority may elect to run a mixed class division based on the suitability of the entries.

7.2 On the last day of racing, no warning signal will be made after 1500 hrs.



8. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 8.1 Each boat shall hold a valid measurement certificate as per their class rules.
- 8.2 Boats may be inspected at any time.

9. VENUE

- 9.1 NoR Attachment A shows the plan of the event venue.
- 9.2 NoR Attachment B shows the location of the racing areas.

10. COURSES

10.1 The course(s) to be sailed will be as described in the Sailing Instructions.

11. PENALTY SYSTEM

11.1 For all Alpha Course boats RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

12. SCORING

- 12.1 Three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 12.2 When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 12.3 When from five (5) to six (6) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

13. SUPPORT & COACH PERSON VESSELS

- 13.1 All external powerboats coaching/supporting competitors for this event shall register with the Organising Authority, the RQYS Sailing Office, prior to the commencement of racing. Registration entitles boats to a range of benefits including launching facilities, overnight berthing, refuelling facilities and access to race course outside of 50m of any competitor or mark between start signal and finish of last boat, except when asked to assist by the Race Committee.
- 13.2 Registration for Support boat can be done on the <u>online portal</u> OR at the RQYS Sailing Office during Registration. Boats that do not have an identifying sticker shall pay \$10.00 to receive an identifying sticker.

- 13.3 Support and spectator boats that do not register will not be permitted to launch or retrieve from RQYS premises, or berth there overnight; the Organising Authority reserves the right to remove such vessels from their premises.
- 13.4 All support/coach boats must have capability of communicating on VHF channel 72, 77 and 16 for the duration of the regatta.

14. CHARTERED OR LOANED BOATS

14.1 A chartered or loaned boat may carry national letters or a sail number in contravention of her class rules, provided that the race committee has approved her sail identification before the first race.

15. BERTHING

- 15.1 Restrictions may be placed on where vessels may be stored or rigged by the RQYS Sailing or Marina office.
- 15.2 No tie down restraints may penetrate the ground deeper than 300mm due to lawn irrigation systems.



16. HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

- 16.1 [DP] All boats will be permitted to haul out daily excluding VX Ones & Etchells which must not be hauled out for the duration of the regatta without the written permission from the Race Committee.
- 16.2 VX Ones & Etchells will be permitted to berth (and raft up) in Docks 3 5 of the VIP docks to the West of the Fuel Dock, overnight on the nights of 09 December 2023.

17. DATA PROTECTION

17.1 By participating in an event, a competitor automatically grants to the Organising Authority and the sponsors of the event, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show, from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or film television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the competition for said event in which the competitor participated and in all material related to the said event without compensation.

18. RISK STATEMENT

- 18.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.
- 18.2 All participants are required to comply with any safety provisions as mandated under the Racing Rules of Sailing, the Australian Sailing Special Regulations Part 2 for Off The Beach Boats, and any Class Rules that may apply. The Squadron encourages and supports competitors who believe it is appropriate to exceed the above requirements (such as the wearing of helmets, body armor, impact vests, etc.) if they or their guardian believe that conditions and their personal circumstances warrant. All competitor's attention is drawn to the Risk Statement Section 18 of the Notice of Race.

19. INSURANCE

19.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$10,000,000AUD per incident or the equivalent.

20. PRIZES

- 20.1 Prizes will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each division.
- 20.2 Additional prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organising Authority.



Green Fleet - Introductory Rules for Racing

Version 1.02 - July 2021

Some Explanations

Windward and *Leeward*: The *leeward* side of your boat is the side where your mainsail lies. The *windward* side is the other side.

Port and Starboard tack: You are on port or starboard tack according to your windward side.

Advisor: A person appointed by the race organizers to assist competitors in understanding the rules and, when appropriate, to penalize a boat.

Basic Rules


- 1. You must comply with the principles of good sportsmanship.
- 2. You must try not to collide with another boat.

Rules When Boats Meet

- 3. When you and the other boat are on opposite *tacks*, if you are on *port tack* you must avoid the boat on *starboard tack*.
- When you and the other boat are on the same tack, you must avoid the other boat
- (a) if she is in front of you, or
- (b) if she is on your *leeward* side.
- 5. After starting, when you and the other boat approach a mark or an object that both boats need to avoid, and the other boat is between you and the mark or other object, you must give her sufficient space to pass it safely on the same side. However, when the boats are on opposite tacks at a windward mark, this rule does not apply.
- When the other boat is required to avoid you, if you
 change course, you must give the other boat an adequate opportunity to avoid you.

Other Rules

- 7. At the starting signal you must be behind the starting line.
- 8. After the starting signal, you must sail the course described by the race organizers.
- 9. You must not touch a mark of the course.
- 10. If you think you or another boat has broken a rule or if you are unclear about the rules at any time during the race, you must describe the incident to the advisor after the race. The advisor may then add two points to the score of any boat that has broken a rule. If the offence is serious, the advisor may refer the matter to the Jury who may deal with the matter as they deem suitable within the spirit of the racing rules of sailing.



Yellow must give space to Blue so both boats can pass the mark on the required side.
