



Tropical Cyclone Alfred Notice 4

Dear Members,

Once again, there has been another change in the forecast for impact from Tropical Cyclone Alfred.

I am sure you are all keeping a close eye on the various weather reports and forecasts, websites, radio & TV news and unfortunately, it is mostly going to be a “waiting” plan as to when and where, it will actually impact on us here in Manly Harbour.

Yesterday, I spoke to Sean & Sheridan down at Canaipa and they have everything locked up and tied down bracing for the storm and will keep you posted on how the new Long House stands up to these conditions.

Even though we sent everyone a [checklist](#) of things to do in securing and preparing your vessel, some members perhaps have not taken this as seriously as they should, so Marina Manager Glen has been around again today to remove potentially dangerous items which had not been secured, such as a Karli float which was specifically mentioned.

So, here we are on Thursday afternoon, waiting for another update and at this stage, winds will be gusting up to 41knts overnight, with heavy rain expected from 9pm and throughout the day on Friday.

Friday morning, winds are expected 24-28knts but gusting up as high as 48knts and predictions for winds to decrease as low as 14knts overnight.

Saturday morning?? Well, that's the latest update for Alfred to make landfall, so please continue to be alert, stay safe and don't come down to the Squadron unless absolutely necessary.

Our team will be here on site to continue monitoring the situation and will assist where and when we can.
